Be Aware of Senior Scams

Throughout the year, it is always wise to be cautious of scams that target seniors. NEVER give out your personal information over the phone, even if the caller claims to be from a federal agency, bank or a company that you have done existing business with. If you not sure about the company, verify information about them with the Better Business Bureau.

USDA Nondiscrimination Statement
